Items other than the above are regarded as "Other papers."</p> <p>Please tie the garbage crosswise with a string, and place it in the "Non-combustible garbage collection location." * In rainy weather, please tie the garbage crosswise with a string, and put it in a plastic bag before putting it out. * On the collection day, garbage is collected twice at each collection location, with two kinds of garbage being picked up each time. (Newspapers and corrugated cardboard are collected in the 1st cycle; while magazines and old cloth are collected in the 2nd cycle.)</p>	<p>Empty boxes</p> <p>Magazines Comic books Please break down any boxes. It is acceptable to place them between magazines, etc.</p> <p>Clothing</p> <p>Blankets Items containing cotton or sponges, etc., are classified as combustible garbage. (However, items that are 50 cm or longer on one side even after being folded are considered bulky waste.)</p> <p>(Containers should be piled up.) Take them out of the bag or box, sort them out as [Bottles/Cans] and [PET bottles], and put them into their own container at the "Non-combustible garbage collection location." * On the collection day, garbage is collected twice at each collection location. (PET bottles in the first cycle, and bottles/cans in the second cycle.)</p>	<p>(Rinse with water) Empty bottles Limited to drink bottles only.</p> <p>Empty cans Limited to drink cans only. * Open-mouthed cans such as milk cans or cookie cans, etc. are regarded as non-combustible garbage.</p> <p>(Rinse with water) PET bottles Limited to those for beverage or seasoning use only, i.e., those with the [PET] mark. * Crush them before putting them out, please. * Remove labels and caps and put them out as plastic containers / packaging.</p> <p>Bottles, Cans PET bottles</p>	<p>Pottery/porcelain Clocks, watches</p> <p>Milk cans</p> <p>Glass waste Other products such as pots, kettles, aluminum containers, disposable pocket warmers, cosmetics bottles, and umbrellas.</p> <p>Please put them into transparent bags or white semi-transparent bags and place in a "Non-combustible garbage collection location."</p>	<p>① Batteries ② Fluorescent lights ③ Aerosol cans Completely remove any contents before when performing disposal. ④ Lighters Completely remove any contents before when performing disposal. ⑤ Small Household Appliances (must be less than 50 cm in length)</p> <p>(Items that are allowed to be placed in the garbage collection location even though they exceed 50 cm in length) Bicycles, Gas cooking stoves *Place a label on it indicating it is "waste."</p> <p>Sort into ①~⑤, put into the corresponding transparent or white semi-transparent bag, and place in a "Non-combustible garbage collection location."</p>	<p>Furniture, bedding, etc.</p> <p>* Items that are more than 50 cm in length such as furniture or futons/blankets cannot be placed in the garbage collection location.</p> <p>In such cases: ① Bring said waste into the Recycling Center directly after placing a call. (Free) ② Call the Environmental Protection Section to make an appointment for garbage collection. (1,000 yen/piece) Either of the above methods can be used. * There might be items that cannot be collected. Please call the Environmental Protection Section in the City Office for detailed information.</p>

○ Please keep it a rule to place the garbage in the collection location **between 5:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.** on the collection day.
○ Please use either transparent or white semi-transparent bags as a garbage bag.

● Either directly carry the garbage to the Sanitation Center or make a request with a professional disposal company (authorized operator).
● Business waste cannot be collected at a garbage collection location.
