

# Sorting and disposal of household waste and recyclables

- The days on which waste (recyclables) is put out for collection and the collection locations differ in some cases depending on the type of waste (recyclables) and the community.
- Put in the effort to correctly sort waste and recycle in order to help build and maintain a positive relationship with your community.
- Waste should be separated and put out for collection at the designated collection points by 8:00 a.m. on collection days.



### Large-sized waste

\*Items which are 60 cm or longer on any side cannot be put out at collection points.


Furniture, futons, etc.



- ① Take directly to the various waste processing facilities (free of charge)
- ② Request collection at house from Environmental Section (Requires reservation and costs ¥1,000 yen per item)

### TVs, air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers

- ① Purchase recycling vouchers at a post office and take to the designated disposal locations.
- ② Request collection by seller, mass electronics retailers, etc.
- ③ Request collection by authorized collection contractor.



### Difficult to process items

Request collection by seller or specialized contractors.



Motorcycles, old tires, concrete, fire extinguishers, batteries, waste oil, paint, agricultural chemicals, construction materials (including built-in furniture and home electronics), pianos, stone, sand, soil, medical devices, etc.
